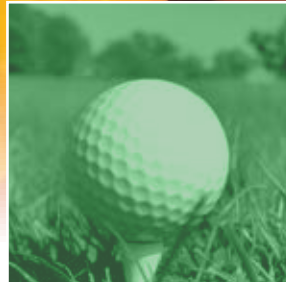

A message from Ken Wilkinson, Parks and Recreation Manager:

What a positive change from last summer as we were able to present many of our programs and events. It was so great to see everyone at the Franklin Park Summer Sunset Concerts and our Viva La Musica Concerts at Miller and Martin Luther King Jr. Parks. The Parks & Recreation staff spent time at these events reaching out and talking to people about parks and what they would like to see in the upcoming years to get more input for our 2022–2027 Comprehensive Master Plan. We passed out survey contact cards to everyone that would take one.

Technology is great. The survey contact cards allowed people to go on our website and take the survey online or scan the QR code on the card and complete it on their phones when it was convenient for them. I saw many people taking the survey while attending the concerts. We were also at the Yakima Downtown Farmers Market AND we mailed out 5000 surveys to randomly selected homes within Yakima city limits.

The survey is a critical part of the master planning process as it helps us plan for improvements. It allows our community to give their opinion(s) about the Parks and Recreation services that we provide, what improvements we should be considering for the future, and how we can improve our programming. We also use the information in our grant applications for improvements—granting organizations are more receptive to giving funds for improvements that are supported by the people that live in the community. Thanks to everyone that took the time to tell us your thoughts.

One of the highlights from this summer was the ribbon-cutting ceremony for the Rotary improvements at Martin Luther King Jr. Park. This has been a long process due to the pandemic, but we

got it done. The new playground, picnic shelter and park lighting were made possible by the generous donations and volunteer work from our Yakima Rotary Clubs. Special thanks to Eric Silvers for his vision to improve this park. It is so rewarding to be able to check these new amenities off the to-do list! The improvements were all identified in our current Comprehensive Master Plan.

We were able to have two summer playground programs this last summer. Juan Arias lead the playground day camp program at Kissel Park and Kim Lopez led the program at Miller Park. Many families benefitted from this program. So many fun things are available to the kids in the summer. They went to Franklin Pool for water games and crafts and when it was really hot, the kids played in the spray park at Miller Park. The Kissel Park Day Camp had a Team Dance Battle one morning. It was a great event.

As we enter fall, we are looking forward to other programs. The Beyond the Bell Program will now be held at the Washington Fruit Community Center at 602 N 4th Street, Yakima. Many kids will be supported after school in this facility. Kim Lopez and her staff will provide many great, fun learning experiences for our kids. They will also provide homework help and a snack.

We have all faced some adversity over these past many months and the legendary coach at Notre Dame, Lou Holtz, said it well, “In adversity, there is opportunity.” I encourage you and your family to continue to embrace new opportunities.

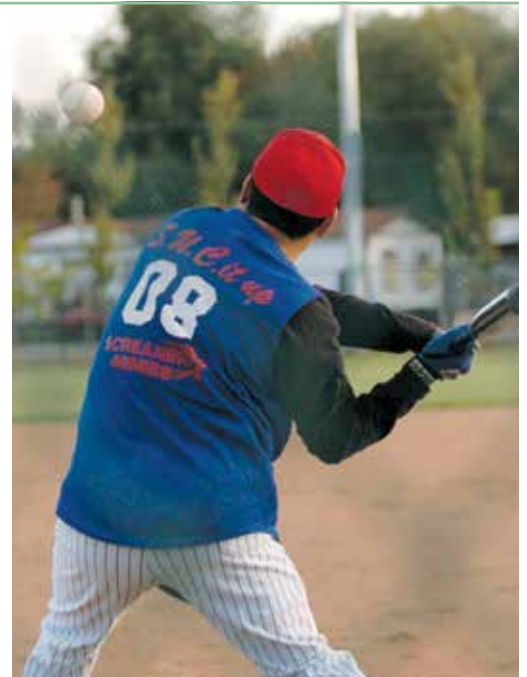

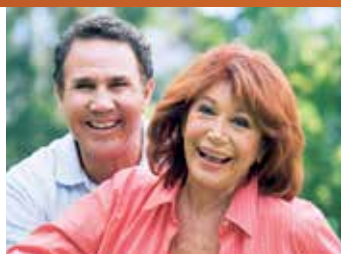
Harman Center Computer Room

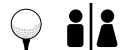

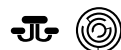

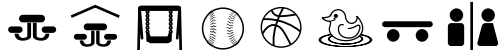

MISSION STATEMENT

The Yakima Parks and Recreation mission is to provide beautiful parks with quality recreation opportunities that enrich the well being of our community.

Refund Policy Yakima Parks and Recreation reserves the right to cancel, reschedule or combine activities as needed.

- If Parks and Recreation cancels an activity, participants will be notified by phone and a full refund will automatically be issued.
- If a Participant requests a refund, the request must be made at least three business days before the activity date and include the registration receipt. Refunds, minus a \$10 processing fee, are issued from the City Treasurer's Office within 30 days. No refund of less than \$10 will be made.
- Refunds for Visa and MasterCard transactions will be credited to the same card used in the original transaction.

Resident discount: Because people living within Yakima's city limits support parks and recreation services through their city taxes, the City offers its residents a discount on selected recreational programs. People living outside the city limits are encouraged to enjoy these activities and services.

Registration Deadline: two days prior to class or activity unless otherwise specified. Each activity has a minimum enrollment and is subject to cancellation if that enrollment is not met. Please register early.

Leaf-A-Legacy Help us to continue providing park and recreation programs, facilities and services to our community. Our "Leaf-A-Legacy" program allows individuals, groups and organizations to help fund the purchase of trees, shrubs and perennials for your parks. Donations can be made for a specific purpose—have trees planted in memory of a loved one, purchase perennials for a designated park, etc.
