A message from Ken Wilkinson, Parks and Recreation Manager:

This summer almost felt back to "normal". But what does normal mean anymore? Well, Franklin Pool was back up to capacity, swim lessons were full again, concerts and movies were played in the parks and of course "Paws in the Pool". All were so much fun! It is wonderful to focus our energy on these great programs and events again.

Progress continues at Miller Park. The playground is done and has been enjoyed by many, especially the oodle swing. The basketball court lights are up and the new fence around the courts is almost done—we are still waiting on the 10' chain link fence. The second picnic shelter was completed in late spring and has been enjoyed by many families this summer. The mosaic pieces will be installed in the park this fall. I have seen some of the progress and they will be amazing. The walkway will be going in this fall and the restroom will be up and running by next April. Our plan is to host a ribbon cutting in November.

The summer day camps at both Miller Park and Kissel Park increased their capacity from 75 kids to 150 kids each thanks to a grant from the Washington Recreation & Park Association (WRPA) in collaboration with the Association of Washington Cities (AWC). The funds were made possible by the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI). Thanks to Kim Lopez and Juan Arias and their amazing

summer staff for working so hard to provide these programs that keep so many kids very busy and having fun all summer.

A grant from the Washington State Legislative Capital Budget is funding the design for a swimming pool in southeast Yakima. The proposed plan is to construct a swimming pool at Martin Luther King Jr. Park in the future. As we move forward with the design, we will share it with the community to get more input.

The tennis courts at Franklin Park were refurbished thanks to a \$5,000 donation for a portion of the resurfacing materials and paint. Parks Maintenance staff completed the work and the pickleball club volunteers painted the pickleball lines. The courts are for tennis, but with the temporary nets they can be used for pickleball too.

These past few years have been a challenge for all of us. But as Socrates said so many years ago, we need to focus "on building the new." That said, we will continue to work on improving your parks! I encourage you to look to the future and where you can focus your energy on positive things.



The Yakima Parks and Recreation mission is to provide beautiful parks with quality recreation opportunities that enrich the well being of our community.

Refund Policy Yakima Parks and Recreation reserves the right to cancel, reschedule or combine activities as needed.

- If Parks and Recreation cancels an activity, participants will be notified by phone and a full refund will automatically be issued.
- If a Participant requests a refund, the request must be made at least three business days before the activity date and include the registration receipt.
 Refunds, minus a \$10 processing fee, are issued from the City Treasurer's Office within 30 days. No refund of less than \$10 will be made.
- Refunds for Visa and MasterCard transactions will be credited to the same card used in the original transaction.

Resident discount: Because people living within Yakima's city limits support parks and recreation services through their city taxes, the City offers its residents a discount on selected recreational programs. People living outside the city limits are encouraged to enjoy these activities and services.

Registration Deadline: two days prior to class or activity unless otherwise specified. Each activity has a minimum enrollment and is subject to cancellation if that enrollment is not met. Please register early.
